

1. THE SCHOOL BOARD SHALL:

- Employ a Superintendent of Schools to serve as chief administrative officer of the School District and professional advisor to the Board.
- Recognize that upon appointment, the Superintendent of Schools becomes an ex officio member of the School Board and must be notified of all School Board meetings.
- Adopt a District policy for expediting School Board-Teacher meetings as per PELRA Amended.
- Keep the schools in session at least the number of days required by statute to qualify for foundation aid; however, they may vote to keep the schools in session beyond this statutory requirement.
- Set the length of the next school year prior to April 1 for the following school year, stating the number of days that the teachers will be required to be employed.
- Approve courses of study, staff and a textbook selection process after recommendation from the Superintendent of Schools.
- Cause the schools to be open to all residents of the District as per Minnesota statutes.
- Charge a tuition for non-resident pupils which shall be maintenance cost per pupil unit in average daily membership, exclusive of transportation, but including capital outlay and debt service costs.
- Refer all complaints received to the Superintendent.

2. THE SCHOOL BOARD MAY:

- Admit non-resident and overage pupils as per Minnesota statutes.

3. THE SCHOOL BOARD MAY:

- Adopt a set of School District policies allowing the Superintendent of Schools to implement School Board policy, rules and regulations of the School District and the laws of the State of Minnesota.
- Work only through the Superintendent of Schools, holding him/her responsible for implementing the decisions of the School Board.
- Expect the Superintendent of Schools to delegate authority to subordinate administrators of the School District.
