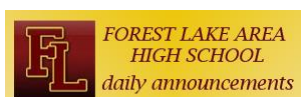

STUDENT OWNED TECHNOLOGY

Students will be required to bring a Wi-Fi enabled device to be used during the school day as a tool for learning. Students will use their device to take notes, research, compose papers, access teachers' web-based resources (Google Docs, etc.), and to hand in papers and documents. While hand-held devices are excellent tools for viewing information, they are not ideal for creating and editing documents. Therefore, we recommend that students bring a laptop, iPad, tablet, or netbook/Chromebook to school, mainly a device with a keyboard. The high school provides guest access to the Wi-Fi network for students during the school day.

Chromebooks are available to "check out" throughout the school year for student use and are available in the Media Center. Chromebooks that are signed out to any student and carry a fine of \$250 if lost, stolen or damaged.

COLLEGE AND CAREER PLANNING

Planning for college and a career is an ongoing process throughout high school. We have a number of resources available to assist students and their families with these important decisions. The deans are an excellent support to guide students as they prepare for the next steps. Additionally, the College and Career Adviser, [Molly Bonnett](#), is available to meet with students and families to answer questions and guide families toward additional resources. Career Launch is a new program at Forest Lake Area High School funded in part with grant dollars awarded by [Youth Skills Training @ Depart of Labor and Industry](#). Forest Lake Area High School, in partnership with Lakes Center for Youth and Families, has created a program to better serve area students and area businesses by providing real world experiential learning opportunities. These opportunities include: Career Day speakers, workplace tours, job shadowing, mentorship, and work based learning. Students will have the opportunity to access these resources, develop their professional skills, attain industry related credentials, and participate in paid work based learning experiences through the Career Launch A (Explore) and Career Launch B (Experience) courses. Both of these courses will be open to 11th and 12th grade students. For the 2019-20 school year, the career fields of focus will be in agriculture, manufacturing, automotive, and construction. RANGER CONNECT

Ranger Connect is a credit bearing course that students will take each year of their high school career. The class meets on Mondays and Tuesdays. Each year, students will earn .25 credit on a pass/fail basis. By graduation, students will have earned 1 credit toward graduation.

Students meet with their Connect teacher to review their academic and social emotional progress, consider options for their future, and make plans for their success. Students will be using the learning management system, Canvas, the career exploration system, Xello, and the app Remind to meet these goals.

New this year, parents and students will be able to access Ranger Connect topics by grade and date on the high school website under "Academics".

PARKING IS A PRIVILEGE

New this school year 2019 – 2020 Families will be given the opportunity to purchase a full year parking pass for \$350.00 dollars removing the challenge of remembering to purchase a semester pass. If a semester pass is all that is needed at this time, the opportunity for that exists as well. There are 2 options in FeePay. Please make sure to purchase the correct pass.

The application process opens August 1 and closes August 28. Those that apply before the deadline will receive their parking pass on September 4. Please apply before the deadline to avoid having to purchase a daily parking pass before your permanent pass will be ready.

You will need to access your [ParentVUE](#) account (at www.hs.forestlake.k12.mn.us) to enroll through [FeePay](#) and then click on the "Activities" button. From there you would select the student you wish to purchase the parking pass for and fill out the information required.

Parking permit applications may be denied due to attendance, discipline issues or outstanding fines.

Students who normally do not drive to school must purchase a one-day permit at the cost of \$5. One-day permits are sold on a space available basis, so it is recommended to buy in advance.

All students parking in the lot without an appropriate parking pass will be subject to a fine with the possibility of additional consequences.

All drivers interested in sharing a parking permit must pick up a paper carpool application in the main office. **The carpool form is not available online.** It must be completed by all drivers and returned with payment by August 28th for processing.
