Creative Corner

Handprint Penguin



Materials:

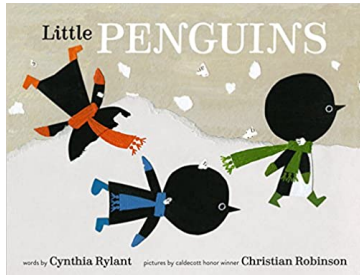
- construction paper
- miscellaneous materials you have lying around the house you could use for the penguin's eyes, beak, tummy - e.g. paper, cotton balls, google eyes
- glue
- scissors

Directions:

- trace your child's handprint on the construction paper
- cut out the handprints
- glue the handprints, fingers pointing down, on paper
- give your child the miscellaneous materials to decorate their penguin

When you are finished listening to the story, see if your child can answer the following questions:

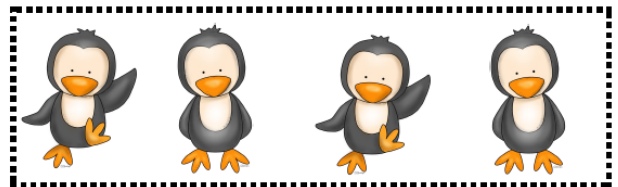
- What did the penguins see when they looked outside the window?
- What do the penguins put on to go outside?
- What did the penguins do outside in the snow?
- What did the penguins do when they went back inside the house?

Penguin Action Sequence Game

This is a fun game to play with your child that works on memory recall, and the math skill of patterning.

Directions:

- Tell your child that they are going to be penguins
- Give your child a sequence of 2 actions to do, e.g. one wing up, both wings down, one wing up, both wings down



- Continue coming up with different sequence actions for your child to copy as long as they are interested in playing the game

Extension Activity: Have your child come up with a sequence/pattern for you to follow
